ATHLETICS REPORT (FROM CATHIE SHERRINGTON)

This has been a very successful year for CPSARA athletics with particular highlights being performances by members at the Rio Paralympics and London World Championships and Inaugural Nottwil Junior World Championships. Particular congratulations to James Turner who won Gold medals in Rio and London, broke 800m and 200m world records and was named Paralympic Rookie of the Year at the 2016 Australian Paralympic Awards.

All of our Athletes at all levels competed and achieved outstanding results in all competitions that they took part in. From our youngest to oldest members they all did well and displayed great attitude and determination to do their very best at all times on the track or out in the field events.

Rio Paralympics September 2016

Four of our members represented Australia in athletics. All four greatly enjoyed the experience and are working towards representing their country again in Tokyo as well as at world championships along the way.

- * Rae Anderson placed 5th in the F37 javelin with a PB and 8th in the F37/38 discus with a season's best performance.
- * Erin Cleaver was 5th in T38 long jump (2cm from bronze) and anchored the bronze medal winning 4 X 100m cerebral palsy relay team.
- * James Turner won the T36 800m breaking the world record in the process! In a gutsy race he led from the gun!
- * Tamsin Colley, the youngest competitor at the games, was on track to make the final when she fell 20m before the line. She got straight back up and finished just behind the field.
